A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,


There is a lot of noise and rumbling around in the parish as many hands are at work transforming our spiritual home into a place of welcome and beauty. I thank you for your patience as this work continues and appreciate your ongoing good stewardship.

Thank you to the Knights of Columbus and Sacred Heart Ladies Club and many more volunteers and chefs who made our parish picnic a Sunday to remember. The joy of kids screaming with delight flying down the bounce house water slide is something that sticks with you.

Having just returned from the Amazing Parish Summit in San Antonio, I must say my mind is buzzing with many thoughts and ideas.

One of them began before I even left. It helps to weave together something that has been on my heart for years and was always hard to grasp or articulate clearly. Yet elements of this have grown over time and I am hopeful in the months and vears to come that it will be fruitful. What is this? Simply put, it is called "A Clear Path to Discipleship." Now what exactly does this mean? If the primary work of the parish is to make disciples, to know Christ and then make even more disciples, what is the clear path to that reality?

First, we must realize as I said last week that the Christian faith is a journey from

separation from God caused by original sin to eternal union with God in heaven. And all of us are somewhere in between. The primary role of the parish is to move us along this path to discipleship and to heaven. There are different thresholds of faith on this path. We generally start out in a place not of faith but of trust, where there is someone or many people of faith in whom we trust who share with us the person of Jesus. From this we come to a place of openness. We are curious and searching because we realize we need something in our lives and things need to change. This leads to a place where we are seeking the truth about God and if we are open, it ultimately leads to a decision for Christ.

Now if we stop there, the question of a clear path to discipleship involves asking ourselves how can people move along that journey in our parish. What events or activities or groups assist those who know nothing of Christ or are just beginning to trust a Catholic or are open to more and seeking. And where do we offer opportunities for people to choose Christ? I certainly think that Foundations of Faith and Discovering Catholicism are a part of this. But part of the question is what is the order and what else is involved?

The other side, once someone takes the decision to follow, they become beginning disciples. How do we assist them there? As they journey into becoming missionary disciples, who want others to know Jesus, and eventually fruitful disciples who disciple others, what do they need? I think our numerous small groups are a part of this. So are the second and third sessions of Foundations of Faith that follow the first session. But how else are we forming disciples at each level of growth?

I hope over the next months and year to work with our Parish Leadership Team and wider parish community to lean into this Clear Path to Discipleship and provide a way for all of us to continue to advance step by step into profound and lifegiving faith.


