

Dear Friends in Christ,

After last week's celebration of St. Katharine Drexel, we have another this Friday with the feast of St. Patrick, who is a patron of our Diocese and therefore, a feast day for us. There is no fasting on such a day as this. Though if you have been fasting from complaining or gossiping or judging, keep doing that fast as it will help us to celebrate festively! We are hoping the weather cooperates on Friday for our Eucharistic Procession but either way, we will definitely have our Mass at 5pm and for those who have reserved their tickets, a feast at St. Patrick Hall.

Thanks to all our volunteers and donors and shoppers for our Annual Tag Sale. We give a special thanks to our two main coordinators and motivators along with all who were good stewards with their time and talent. I personally love rummage sales. There is always some treasure worth buying.

Thanks as well to all who joined us for our 24 Hours of Adoration before the Lord in the Eucharist. There is no more powerful prayer. If you did not get a chance, come find some time. The excuses we use are weak and the grace God can give is so strong. So make time! Also, if you did not get a chance to experience the Lord's mercy in Confession this past week, we had 5 different priests between Saturday and Tuesday come through, find some

time. We make time for all sorts of things that in the plan of salvation matter little sports practices, video games, TV watching, screen scrolling, and the like. There is nothing more important than your relationship with God.

Below I have a couple of the tables that Dr. Bob Schuchts uses in his Be Healed book. They speak of two different ways in which we need healing, from deadly sins that are focused on some idol to worship. These are good sources of reflection as we ponder where we need healing in our lives. As we realize that we can trust God because He is love and compassion and mercy and understanding, it is a good moment to ask the Lord where we are preventing His grace from entering.

When it comes to deadly wounds, these are experiences where we have had of a lack of love from those who should love us, especially as children, and as well, people who have treated us unlovingly. This is not about placing blame but more so how our hearts have been wounded and need to be healed. They become rooted as beliefs that we have come to then see as a part of our identity, even as they are false. I cannot tell you how many times people have said they cannot change, or feel unloved or unwanted or worthless or alone. All of these beliefs are false and keep us from experiencing the fullness of God's mercy and love.

The other chart reveals the kinds of sins, which are generally the fruit of false be-

liefs and wounds, that we have come to embrace and what we then worship. Since we are made in God's image and likeness, and called to relationship with Him, when we turn from God or feel as if we can no longer trust Him, we seek other things to worship. These things cannot fill the depths of our soul for we are made for God alone. Yet they become a cheap alternative, different idols that are presented as worthy of our lives, that ultimately wounds and false beliefs, as well as deadly lead us away from God and His love. Identifying your idols and your major vices is critical to freedom and healing in Christ. For as we know where we are bound, we can ask Christ for freedom in those places.

> Today, I encourage you to pick up a copy of some very powerful prayers of renunciation. The idea of renunciation is recognizing that while we have not made a covenant with sin, there are places where evil has gotten a foothold in our lives, and it needs to be removed. Renunciation in the name of Christ breaks the power these sorts of things, vices and forms of unforgiveness and even false beliefs, have exercised over us. If you are struggling with lust or gluttony or pride and the like, they can be helpful when repeated. We can pray these sorts of prayers in the name of Christ because we were baptized into Christ and now have the authority to call on His name to intercede for us.

May God bless you in His mercy!

THE LENTEN SEASON

Lenten Regulations (abbreviated): Ash Wednesday through Holy Thursday, February 22 - April 6



Abstinence and Fasting. All persons 14+ years are obliged to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent. Abstinence from alcohol, TV, and electronic entertainment are also spiritually beneficial. Everyone ages 18-59 are obliged to *fast* on Good Friday (one full meal/day; two other small meals may be eaten but

together should not equal a full meal; no eating between meals).

Confession. You are obliged to confess grave sins at least once a year and observe forms of penance.

I encourage you to please make use of it, especially if it has been many months or even years. Those who serve and minister before the Lord need to constantly be searching their hearts and seeking to grow closer to God, while also honestly assessing where there is need for conversion.

Keep in mind, part of your commitment to serving in these ministries is living in a state of grace or friendship with God, for your own sake and for the sake of the Body of Christ. Stations of the Cross. You are encouraged to participate in

Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

Easter Duty. If initiated into the Holy Eucharist, you are bound to receive holy communion worthily at least once during the Easter Season.

Prayer, Almsgiving, Other Charitable Works. You are urged to read and pray with Sacred Scripture more intently during Lent and encouraged to participate in special devotions (Eucharistic Adoration, Rosary, Divine Mercy, vocations to priesthood, etc.). You are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, including the Annual Catholic Appeal. Other charitable works include visiting the sick, homebound, aged, and those in prison.

Are we that anxious to share our encounters at the well? The woman at the well did more than fetch Jesus a drink, she was the staff that drew forth the "living" water for her village, just as Moses did for the Israelites long ago, at Massah and Meribah.




