

Dear Friends in Christ,

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia Alleluia!

Now what does this proclamation mean? Here I quote again from Joseph Ratzinger before he was Pope Benedict. Some might ask why I often quote from him. I consider him one of if not the greatest theologian of our age. One only needs to read his many works to understand how rich and deep his study of the faith has been. His encyclicals, his homilies, his books on the life of Christ and more are just one great masterpiece after another. As you know, I am not one prone to exaggerating praise. So take that for what it is worth. But please read his words, instead of mine about him. This comes from "Introduction to Christianity":

"To the Christian, faith in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is an expression of certainty that the saying that seems to be only a beautiful dream is in fact true: "Love is strong as death" (Song 8:6). In the Old Testament this sentence comes in the middle of praises of the power of eros. But this by no means signifies that we can simply push it aside as a lyrical exaggeration. The boundless demands of eros", its apparent exaggerations and extravagance, do in reality give expression to a basic problem, indeed the" basic problem of human existence, insofar as they reflect the nature and

intrinsic paradox of love: love demands infinity, indestructibility; indeed, it is, so to speak, a call for infinity. But it is also a fact that this cry of love's cannot be satisfied, that it demands infinity but cannot grant it; that it claims eternity but in fact is included in the world of death, in its loneliness and its power of destruction. Only from this angle can one understand what "resurrection" means. It is" the greater strength of love ships need to be renewed? Who in our in face of death.

"At the same time it is proof of what only immortality can create: being in the means authentic life-giving, God driven other who still stands when I have fallen apart. Man is a being who himself does not live forever but is necessarily delivered up to death. For him, since he has no continuance in himself, survival, from a purely human point of view, can only become possible through his continuing to exist in another. The statements of Scripture about the connection between sin and death are to be understood from this angle. For it now becomes clear that man's attempt "to be like God", his striving for autonomy, through which he wishes to stand on his own feet alone, means his death, for he just cannot stand on his own. If man-and this is the real nature of sinnevertheless refuses to recognize his own limits and tries to be completely self-sufficient, then precisely by adopting this attitude he delivers himself up to death."

The resurrection then is the fulfillment of our desire for the dream of love, eternal undying love, to be reality. Love is fulfilled in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

As we enter into this Easter season, ask yourself how you might live in light of the resurrection? What still matters if love is what endures? What relationlives are we called to encounter? Or who perhaps do we need to forgive or be forgiven by? Love endures, which relationships endure. So renew those relationships.

I like to make mention ahead of time when I'll be gone but it seems to throw people off but just know in the near future I have some days off to rest after the busyness of Lent and Holy Week. It has been a trying time but a good one, with much fruit. If we are not tired, perhaps we have not worked as much as we should. But I will be here this week for the Easter Octave so come join us for daily Mass. Each Mass is celebrated as the day of Easter once more.

May the Glory of the Resurrection enlighten your life,
