A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Are you divided on whether to experience a bit of healing prayer in the next couple weeks? So was I! As I mentioned on Sunday, I went to an Unbound Priest Retreat last Summer and after a number of conferences that explained what Unbound was, they asked us to sign up for an Unbound session. An Unbound session is a bit different from healing prayer as it is more intense in terms of the amount of time involved and preparation required. So I was hesitant probably more than you are about healing prayer.

At first I said no. I told myself I would just observe and watch and learn. But the night before the first sessions were to begin, I sensed the Holy Spirit moving in my heart and as I prayed, I realized there was "stuff" I needed to bring to an Unbound session and receive healing and freedom. And so I signed up! Gulp. I remember walking into the room with Matt Lozano, who is one of the main coordinators of Unbound, and a couple priests who would accompany me, with a sense of impending doom and the unknown. I am quite dramatic at moments like that. What happened next was the

Holy Spirit. See, in an Unbound session, a key piece is an interview where they ask you about places of hurt and unforgiveness.

As I spoke, I began to realize how heavy certain moments in my life had been and how I harbored hurt and unforgiveness. I wept, perhaps like I have never wept before, but they were tears of a broken heart desiring freedom and love in Christ. It was powerful. I left with such greater freedom. One of the images I was left with was a child playing and God the Father rejoicing over him. That child was me. And to know the Father's joy in my life and how He was always watching over me, even in my moments of darkness, was a fountain of mercy and grace for me. So often the wounds of our past we think we just need to tuck away or perhaps they were not nearly as bad as we remember. Or we have simply covered them up and moved on. Except the wounds remain. And so the wounds and the beliefs and the lies that flow from it continue to exercise power over us. Christ wants freedom and friendship for us. I have experienced so much more of that freedom and healing through Unbound. I am hopeful that one day each of you can also experience Unbound.

But for now, I encourage you to consider meeting one of our Prayer Teams after Mass over the next two weekends for healing prayer. There is not a lot to it so you need not be afraid. Our Prayer Teams will simply introduce themselves and ask you what you would like prayer for in your own life. You can be as

specific or vague as you prefer. You may want freedom from worry or anxiety or fear. You may need prayer to know the Father's love for you. You may need help to forgive those who have terribly wounded you. You can look at the charts below to help guide you.

The Prayer Teams will then invite you to read a written prayer we will have prepared ahead of time for you and then pray with you for healing and freedom in Christ. It is pretty simple. And I hope you will consider it. I cannot tell you what it was like walking out of that room having renounced the power of sin and the lies I had come to believe as well as proclaiming forgiveness in the name of Christ. But it was joy. I want that joy to be yours as well.

Also, we are making a slight change to our prayer list for the sick. In the past we permitted people to be on there indefinitely. We are going to change that slightly to be more current. We will only have people on the prayer list for a maximum of three months. If there is a new reason or a serious ongoing reason to be on the prayer list, you can certainly call back and ask for someone to be put on the prayer list again for three months. But in an effort to keep those who need immediate prayer at this time, we are going to limit the time on the prayer list to three months. We also have our prayer intention book in the those intentions are remembered at a single specific Mass. This is a great place to write your intentions for ongoing needs and concerns for those you love.

Lenten Abstinence and Fasting Obligations through Holy Thursday, April 6



Abstinence and Fasting. All persons 14+ years are obliged to *abstain from meat* on all Fridays of Lent. Abstinence from alcohol, TV, and electronic entertainment is also spiritually beneficial.

Everyone ages 18-59 are obliged to *fast* on Good Friday (one full meal/day; two other small meals may be eaten but together should not equal a full meal; no eating between meals).
