Dear Friends in Christ,

On Saturday our two **Young Ladies Institutes**, Gemma and Columbia, were consolidated into one, now representing the entire parish of St. Katharine Drexel. Their new Institute goes by *Our Lady of Hope*. With their joining together, there is much hope for the future of YLI here in our parish, especially as we seek to grow as Christian disciples and witnesses of Christ's charity. Please pray for their new Institute as they start meeting on the first Monday of the month here at SKD in April.

I hope all of you enjoyed our **Parish Mission** with Fr. Jewel. Please say a prayer for him and all his brother missionaries in the Missionary Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy. Their ministry is unique in form, as they are sent, often weeks on end, all over the country, to preach the Gospel and call people to repentance.

This week our Diocese also celebrates the annual **Chrism Mass**. This takes place on Thursday April 7 at 6pm at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento. I highly encourage you to go if you can. At this Mass the Bishop blesses all the holy oils we use in our Easter sacraments, including the oil of the catechumen or holy oil (Oleum Sanctorum), the oil of the sick (Oleum Infirmorum), and the holy Chrism oil (Sacrum Chrisma).

Pope Benedict at the Chrism Mass in St. John Lateran in 2011 said the following: *"They express three essential dimensions of the Christian life on which we may now reflect. First, there is the oil of catechu-*

mens. This oil indicates a first way of being touched by Christ and by his Spirit – an inner touch, by which the Lord draws people close to himself. Through this first anointing, which takes place even prior to baptism, our gaze is turned towards people who are journeying towards Christ – people who are searching for faith, searching for God. The oil of catechumens tells us that it is not only we who seek God: God himself is searching for us.

"Then there is the oil for anointing the sick. Arrayed before us is a host of suffering people: those who hunger and thirst, victims of violence in every continent, the sick with all their sufferings, their hopes and their moments without hope, the persecuted, the downtrodden, the broken-hearted. Regarding the first mission on which Jesus sent the disciples, Saint Luke tells us: "he sent them out to preach the kingdom of God and to heal" (9:2). Healing is one of the fundamental tasks entrusted by Jesus to the Church, following the example that he gave as he travelled throughout the land healing the sick.

"In third place, finally, is the most noble of the ecclesial oils, the chrism, a mixture of olive oil and aromatic vegetable oils. It is the oil used for anointing priests and kings, in continuity with the great Old Testament traditions of anointing. In the Church this oil serves chiefly for the anointing of confirmation and ordination. Today's liturgy links this oil with the promise of the prophet Isaiah: "You shall be called the priests of the Lord, men

shall speak of you as the ministers of our God" (61:6). The prophet makes reference here to the momentous words of commission and promise that God had addressed to Israel on Sinai: "You shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (Ex 19:6)."

At this Mass, the priests of the Diocese also renew their priestly promises. This includes a promise to pray with and for the people of God, especially through the Liturgy of the Hours; to obey and respect the Bishop and his authority; to live a celibate life following the example of Christ himself; to reverently celebrate the Church's sacraments, especially the Holy Mass and Confession; to be a co-worker with the Bishop in caring for the flock entrusted to His care; to preach the Gospel and teach the Catholic faith and to so imitate Christ in serving the Church.

Lastly, next weekend begins our **Holy Week**. It starts with Palm Sunday and continues until the night of the Easter Vigil. This is a time to not slack on our penances, especially as we get to the Holy Triduum, starting Holy Thursday, but rather to be faithful and even perhaps add on to the cross we have chosen to carry. Perhaps consider some kind of fasting regimen for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. We do not need anyone else passing out but we can still fast in sacrificial ways and so prepare for the glorious resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Summary of Lenten Regulations, March 2 – April 14

A link to the complete Lenten Regulations can be found on the parish website, amadorcatholic.com.

Abstinence and Fasting. All persons 14+ years are obliged to **abstain from meat** on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Abstinence from alcohol, TV, and electronic entertainment are also spiritually beneficial. Everyone ages 18 - 59 is obliged to **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (one full meal/day; two other small meals may be eaten but together should not equal a full meal; no eating between meals).

Confession. You are obliged to confess grave sins at least once a year and observe forms of penance. The parish offers additional confession times during Lent.

Stations of the Cross. You are encouraged to participate in Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

Easter Duty. If initiated into the Holy Eucharist, you are bound to receive holy communion worthily at least once during the Easter Season.

Prayer, Almsgiving, Other Charitable Works. You are urged to read and pray with Sacred Scripture more intently during Lent and encouraged to participate in special devotions (Eucharistic Adoration, Rosary, Divine Mercy, vocations to priesthood, etc.). You are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, including the Annual Catholic Appeal. Other charitable works include visiting the sick, homebound, aged, and those in prison.

Lenten Confession Times

Along with our regular hours, we have extended the start time on Thursdays to 11:15 AM and added Confessions on Wednesdays from 5:30 to 6 PM. Take advantage of these expanded hours to be reconciled with God in His mercy.

Sunday Adoration

During Lent, we expose the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration on Sundays from **9 to 10 AM** and **11 AM to 12 noon**. You are invited to come early or stay late and spend some time before our Lord who speaks to us in the quiet of our hearts.

Liturgy of the Hours

We pray the *Liturgy of the Hours* on Tuesdays at 6:30 PM and Wednesdays at 6:30 AM at SKD (no longer on Fridays.) The Liturgy of the Hours is an ancient prayer of the Church where one prays the Psalms at different moments of the day. No previous practice needed. Anyone can follow along on the app *iBreviary*.


