A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

All glory to Jesus Christ, our Lord and our God.

I love Sacred Silence, especially during the Holy Mass. In a world filled with constant noise—the chatter of phones, the hum of traffic, the endless stream of information and news—silence has become rare, even uncomfortable. Yet, in the Sacred Liturgy, silence is not emptiness. It is presence. It is the quiet space where God speaks most deeply to the human heart.

The Mass is full of words: prayers, readings, responses, hymns that can easily feel routine, moving quickly from one thing to the next. But just as a beautiful song needs “rests” between the notes, so too the Liturgy needs moments of silence for its melody of grace to reach our souls. Silence in the Mass is not an absence of activity; it is a form of participation, a listening, a receptivity, a resting and sitting in and with God.

At the very beginning of the Mass, after the priest invites us to acknowledge our sins, there is a pause, a dramatic pause. This silence is an examination of the heart. It is the time to bring before God the ways we have failed to love Him and one another. Instead of rushing

through it, we can let that silence become a moment of honesty, humility, and trust. Trust that God’s mercy is greater than our weakness, but we must first acknowledge our weaknesses.

After the readings, we are again invited to silence. This is a sacred pause to let the Word of God sink in. Too often, we treat the readings as information to be heard rather than a message to be received. But God speaks personally through His Word. In the silence that follows, we can ask, “Lord, what are You saying to me today? What truth do You want to plant in my heart?”

The most profound silence comes after the homily and especially during the Eucharistic Prayer. As the bread and wine are lifted, heaven touches earth. In that moment, words fall short. Our silence becomes Adoration. It is the silence of Mary at the foot of the Cross, the silence of awe before Mystery. We do not need to say much; it is enough to be there, to let our hearts whisper the words of the Apostle Thomas, “My Lord and my God” (John 20:28).

After receiving Holy Communion, there should again be a deep and intimate silence. The Church calls this “Sacred

Silence”. It is the time to rest in Christ who now dwells within us. Too often, we hurry to fill that silence with song or movement or see what other people are wearing or what they’re doing. But if we sit or kneel quietly for a few moments and close our eyes, we can savor the gift we have just received, allowing His presence to heal, strengthen, and console us.

Silence, then, is not a break in the Liturgy, it is a very important part of the Liturgy. It allows the Word to echo, the Sacrament to take root, and the heart to respond. When we embrace silence, we learn to listen not only to God but also to one another, and even to our own souls.

So the next time the Mass grows quiet, do not be afraid. Let the silence speak. Let it draw you into the mystery. For in that stillness, we meet the God who is not far away, but closer than our breath, whispering in the depths of our hearts: “Be still, and know that I am God” (Ps 46:10).
