

Brothers and sisters in Christ:

To continue with our reflection on the rosary with Saint Pope John Paul II and his Apostolic Letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae, this week I will reflect on paragraphs two (2) through eight (8) from the introduction.

I would like to touch upon. The first will be a slight introduction to Blessed Bartolo Longo. Bartolo grew up Catholic, but fell away when he was attending university. While in the university he started to practice satanic worship and eventually became a satanic high priest. In the middle of a séance he attended he stood up and raised a medal of the Blessed Virgin Mother and yelled, "I renounce spiritism because it is nothing but a maze of error and falsehood."

He eventually became a Third order Dominican and took the name Brother Rosario in honor of the Rosary. Bartolo continued to promote the Rosary until his death on October 5, 1926, at the age of 75. In 1939, the church Bartolo and his wife built was enlarged and reconstructed as a basilica. It was officially renamed the Basilica of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary of Pompeii.

I started with Blessed Bartolo simply because in the first few lines of paragraph two it states, "Rosary as an effective spiritual weapon against the evils afflicting society". In today's world, The introduction has several points that if you have not noticed, what was once taboo is now main stage in our media and on television. These are exactly the areas where we need to bring in the Rosary. Bring the light of the Gospel truths to situations that have been dimmed by our modern society.

> The next quote that I found interesting was from Pope Paul VI which he reminds us that "not only does this prayer (the Rosary) not conflict with the Liturgy, it sustains it, since it serves as an excellent introduction and a faithful echo of the Liturgy, enabling people to participate fully and interiorly in it and to reap its fruits in their daily lives. By praying the Rosary and meditating on the mysteries we are focusing on the life of Jesus through the eyes of Mary. When focusing on these mysteries we start internalizing the Gospels in our daily lives, inviting God into those places and situations on which we are praying."

> This can only bring honor to our blessed Mother Mary, which in turn brings

honor, love and glory to her Son. When Jesus was on the Cross, he told John, "Behold your Mother", and Mary, "Behold your son". In these simple words, Jesus shares His Mother with us, and Mary takes on a motherly role, ready to walk with us through our trials, fears, and joys.

Our "commitment to the contemplation of the Christian mystery" is exercised when meditating on and praying the mysteries of the Rosary. Saint John Paul II reiterates a quote from his Apostolic Letter Novo Millennio Ineunte that reflecting on these mysteries is a genuine training in holiness: "What is needed is a Christian life distinguished above all in the art of prayer". He goes on further and says that through all the influences of the world "it is more urgent than ever that our Christian communities should become genuine schools of prayer". This is what the Rosary helps us to form within ourselves, our friendships, and in our families, the primary cell of society".

So let's rediscover the Rosary as a "means to immerse ourselves in contemplation of the mystery of Christ who "is our peace".




